Title: Nail Technician/Specialist and Manicurist

Definition: A program that prepares individuals to shape fingernails and toenails, remove unwanted skin and blemishes, apply polish and cosmetics to nails, and function as licensed manicurists or nail technicians/specialists. Includes instruction in manicuring theory; skin anatomy; nail growth, irregularities, and diseases; sterilization and sanitation; equipment and table maintenance; cuticle, blemish, and rough skin removal; nail filing, shaping, and polishing; cream application and extremity massage; nail sculpture and design art; product storage and use; customer service; laws and regulations; and business practices.

Graduates of this program receive a diploma in Manicuring (occupational, technical or education program of less than two years)

The normal time of completion in the Cosmetology program is approx. 5 months for full time students.

The completion rate for students scheduled to complete this program from July 1, 2010 - June 30, 2011 was 42%. 100% of those students completed the program within the normal time frame reported above.

66% percent of students completing the program between July 1, 2010 and June 30, 2011 completed with student loan debt.

The median (average) Federal student loan debt for students who completed the program between July 1, 2010 and June 30, 2011 was \$2497.00. None of our students had any private loan debt or school financing plan debt.

The job placement rate for program completers was 66%. This rate includes all students who completed the program between July 1, 2010 and June 30, 2011. This job placement rate looks only at jobs that were related to the Manicuring field.

Positions that recent graduates were hired for include: Manicure, pedicure, artificial nail application services. This rate is based on graduates who were employed in the field within their first year after completion and were employed for at least 13 weeks. We track graduate placement through in-person follow-up with our former students. Job placement rates are reported to our accrediting agency – NACCAS (National Accrediting Commission of Career Arts and Sciences)
